Point scheme

Transfers will be made based on a point scheme described below

Grade	Marking Scheme
Preliminary Grade	<p><u>Valid period</u> First two years from the date of first appointment</p> <p><u>Point calculation</u> 2 per year - Maximum of 4 points will be given.</p>
Grade 11	<p><u>Valid period</u> First ten years from the date of appointment to Grade 11 to Grade 1 or Specialist Grade (Marks for those medical officers who are in continuous service for more than ten years will be given for the first ten years only)</p> <p><u>Point calculation</u> 2 per year - Maximum of 20 points will be given.*</p>
Grade 1	<p><u>Valid period</u> Only for the medical officers those who promoted to grade 1 before promoting to specialist grade. From the date of Grade 1 promotion to Specialist Grade promotion. There is no upper limit.</p> <p><u>Point calculation</u> 2 per year will be given to relevant period.</p>
Specialist Grade	<p><u>Valid period</u> From the date of Specialist Medical Officer Grade promotion to December 31st of previous year to new annual transfer. There is no upper limit.</p> <p>(Ex: For annual transfer of 2017, points will be given up to 31st December 2016)</p> <p><u>Point calculation</u> 4 per year will be given to relevant period.</p>
No Pay Leave	<p>2 points per year will be deducted for no pay leave obtained by grade medical officers during the valid period.</p> <p>4 points per year will be deducted for no pay leave obtained by specialist grade medical officers during the valid period</p>

Note

1. Under this scheme, points will not be awarded to more than one grade at the same time. (when the officer entitled to points in more than one grade, the officer will be given points the grade for which he/ she could get the highest points)
2. Medical officers promoted to Grade 1 before 09.05.1994, date on which the minute in regard to the medical personnel was amended are entitled to a maximum of twenty four points (First 12 years).
3. Those Medical officers who were promoted to Grade 1 after 09.05.1994, the date of amendment of the minute in regard to medical personnel will be entitled to a maximum of twenty points (First 10 years).
4. Those medical officers, who had to remain more than 10 years in grade 11 on 09.05.1994 the date minute in regard to medical personnel was amended, are entitled to twenty points to the first ten years and thereafter 0.5 per every additional three months.
5. In the event of two applicants obtaining equal aggregate of points, placement will be determined by the grade seniority or the post intern merit list.
6. For periods of no-pay leave spent within the country or abroad, the following procedure will be adopted in calculating points :-
 - I. No points will be awarded for no-pay leave taken by an officer except for medical reasons
 - II. For medical leave, points will be given only to period supported by proper medical certificates. (eg. When the officer is sick overseas, the medical certificates submitted through the respective embassy or the High Commission) acceptable to the Department of Health Service and the Ministry of Health as at present. (approval should be obtained from the medical board appointed by the Ministry of health)
 - III. When an officer who is abroad falls sick, it is the responsibility of the medical officer concerned to bring this to the notice of the Director – General of Health Services. This should be done within a period of two weeks.
 - IV. In situation where an officer who is abroad avails himself/herself of medical leave exceeding three months, the documents related to the illness should be produced before a properly constituted medical board

appointed by the ministry of health as isapplicable for similar leave availed of locally. No points will be given for leave not approved by the medical board. The medical board approval should be obtained by every three months period as instructed by E Code.

- V. For period approved as half pay leave, the officer will be entitled only half the number of points recommended for the period except maternity leave.

- VI. Medical officer who went on-pay leave before the establishment of the Post Graduate Institute of Medicine on Sri Lanka for the purpose of obtaining post Graduate qualification as set out in Appendix I of the medical Service Minute, published in the Government Gazette No. 14840 of 17th February, 1969 will be treated as for paid leave and will be given points for the period of leave, they had taken as no-pay leave to obtain the stipulated Post-Graduate qualification and this will be allowed once only. No-pay leave taken for any other purpose by these officers will not be considered for the calculation of points.
