Seminar Content	This project is themed public service and poverty reduction. Integrating with China's practice and experiences in improving the rural public service system to push ahead with sustained poverty reduction, enhancing international cooperation in poverty alleviation between China and other developing countries and boosting further improvements in models for national economic and social development strategies, the project will invite government officials and researchers concerning rural development, agriculture development, employment and social security, science and		

	<p>technology progress, education, health care, ecological conservation, finance and other poverty reduction-related areas to discuss such issues. The seminar is divided into four sessions: thematic lecture, case study, country-specific speech, and discussion after video visit.</p> <p>The thematic lectures focus on China's strategies for and practice in rural development, China's policies for and practice in rural public service development, China's anti-poverty strategies and practice, China's policies for and practice in boosting rural employment, China's policies for and practice in rural education development, China's policies for and practice in improving health care services in rural areas, China's policies for and practice in science and technology development in rural areas, China's policies for and practice in rural ecological conservation, China's policies for and practice in rural financial development and China's policies for and practice in social security in rural areas.</p> <p>The case studies demonstrate China's projects that can play exemplary roles in rural development, combating poverty, boosting employment, public services, social security, ecological conservation and building, showcase China's specific measures and outstanding results in enhancing rural public service, implementing targeted poverty alleviation strategy and improving social and economic development mechanism for striving to improve people's living standard.</p> <p>In the country-specific speech session, each country's delegate in the seminar will be invited to introduce the experiences of his/her country in promoting poverty alleviation through improving public service, analyze the problems and challenges besieging these countries in improving public service and pushing ahead with sustained poverty reduction, in a bid to offer reference for other countries to optimize the policies, measures and work mechanisms for improving public service for poverty alleviation.</p> <p>In the video visit session, the videos on introducing China's key practice and experience in implementing projects related to improving rural public service for poverty reduction will be played. Participants can have a closer look at how China boosts employment, improves health care and education, relocates the poor from inhospitable areas, and carries out ecological governance as well as offers social security.</p> <p>In addition, the seminar will introduce China's national conditions and traditional culture, its poverty alleviation measures taken to address the impact of COVID-19 on the poor masses, and successful cases in the prevention and control of COVID-19 in China.</p>

Participants need to have access to the Internet, a computer, a microphone, a camera and other equipment. Before the seminar, we will organize a technique test of the devices and the Internet to solve potential bugs or problems. Please take part in the test at the given time. 2. During the seminar, participants are requested to abide by class time and teaching disciplines. Seminar completion certificates will be issued on the basis of attendance

Preparation before class: participants should enter the classroom 15 minutes in advance to prepare for class and change the personal title to English name (consistent with passport) - country name style. During the class, participants' microphones are set to mute by the host. While preparing for the class, participants need to turn on the video for the host to see.</p> <p>4. Disciplinary requirements: Please comply with the schedule and never be absent without any excuse. If anyone cannot be present, he/she has to get the organizer informed in advance.</p> <p>5. Information security: In order to protect information security and personal privacy, participants should not record, take screenshots or share to any social media during class.</p> <p>6. Participants should prepare relevant materials for symposiums according to the schedule and submit relevant electronic materials as required.</p> <p>7. Online consecutive English interpretation is provided.</p>
About the Organizer	<p>The International Poverty Reduction Center in China (IPRCC) was established in May 2005 as an outcome of Shanghai Global Conference on Scaling Up Poverty Reduction in 2004. IPRCC was jointly initiated and established by the Chinese government, the UNDP and the World Bank. It is designed as an international platform for research, training, exchange, collaboration and knowledge sharing in poverty reduction. IPRCC is committed to the internationalization of China's poverty reduction experience, as well as the localization of global experience, so as to forge an integrated platform for poverty reduction and development. Since 2005, IPRCC has successfully held 160 international seminars on poverty reduction, which have been participated in by 4,264 government officials and poverty reduction practitioners from 136 countries. IPRCC has developed a training textbook titled "Ten Keys to Understanding China's Poverty Reduction" as well as video textbooks and micro video cases on international poverty reduction. In the central and western regions in China, 15 provinces have been identified as "China Poverty Alleviation Exchange Bases". Participants can be arranged to visit the bases to learn about the effectiveness of poverty alleviation policies and practices. IPRCC also has an international training team that understands business, knows foreign languages and has high quality. At the same time, it has compiled and printed the international training manual for poverty reduction, which has strengthened the standardized management and promoted the high-quality development of project implementation. IPRCC has two training classrooms, each covering an area of 120 square meters. In 2020, it organized multiple online international poverty reduction exchange activities, demonstrating its capacity of providing necessary venues and equipment for online training.
